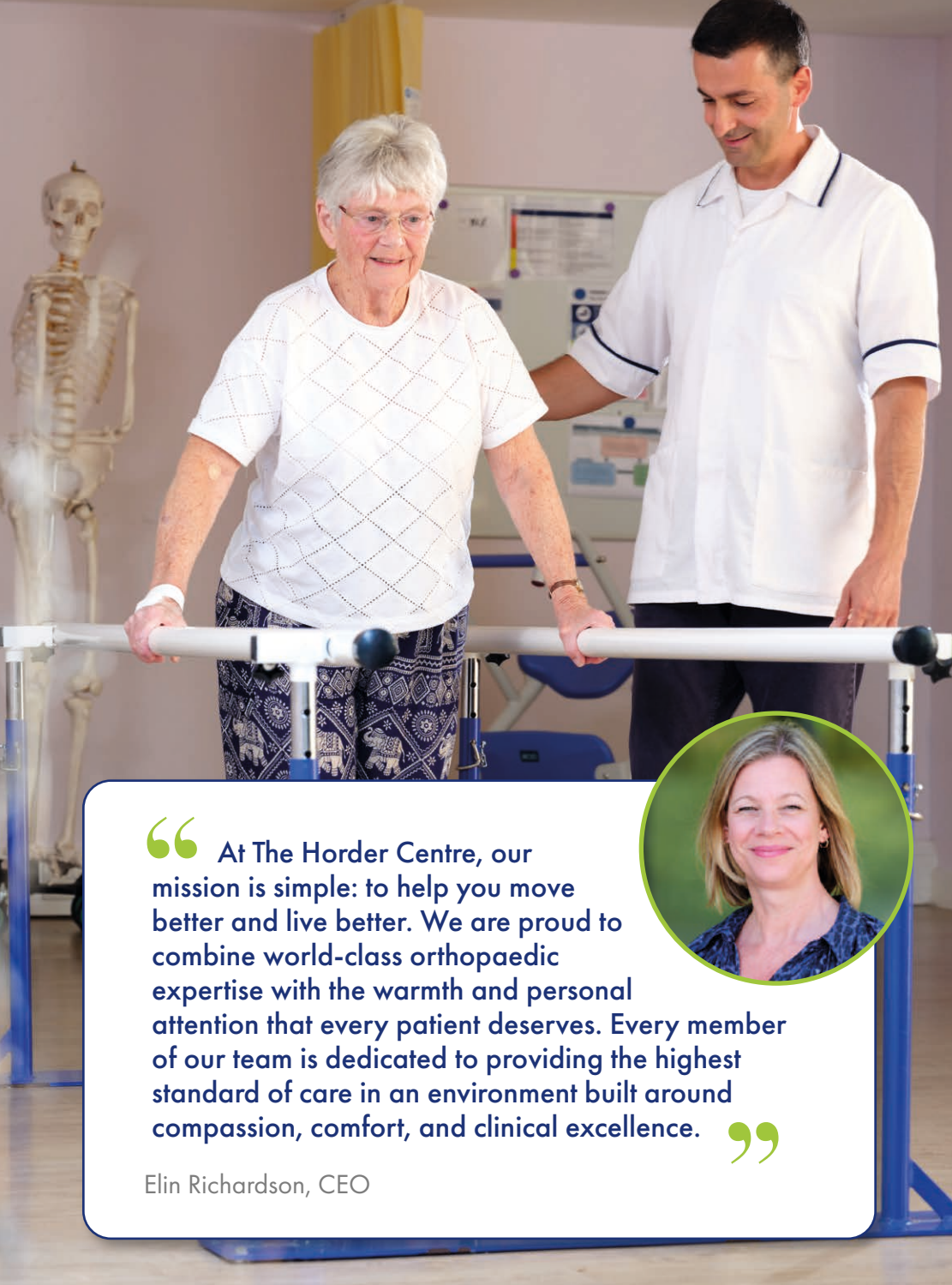

Outstanding Facilities

The Horder Centre is located in beautiful, tranquil grounds on the edge of the stunning Ashdown Forest, yet within easy reach of the region's main towns and villages. It is home to state-of-the-art medical facilities, including the latest robotic surgical technology, one of UK's largest teams of specialist orthopaedic surgeons, and patient care and visitor amenities that ensure your treatment experience is as comfortable as possible.

Consultation Rooms

We have six outpatient consultation rooms and five outpatient therapy consulting rooms for access to individual physiotherapy/osteopathy and other musculoskeletal services.

Operating theatres

Our three state-of-the-art operating theatres are equipped with laminar flow and have suitable space and facilities to support a wide range of surgical procedures. We also have our own instrument decontamination facilities on site.

Outpatient gym

Our outpatient gym provides state of the art fitness equipment and a tranquil space for classes which include Pilates, HIIT 50 and Balance and Flexibility.

Diagnostic suite

Our diagnostic suite provides access to radiology services including x-rays, ultrasound and MRI scanning.

Day Services Unit

Knees



ACL reconstruction

Knee injuries commonly occur for those involved in sports but can also happen if your leg or knee becomes twisted. If your knee continually gives way after an accident or injury, it could be a sign that your anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) has ruptured – meaning a significant tear to the ligament that joins your thigh bone and knee joint. ACL reconstruction offers the chance of improving the stability of your knee in everyday life and sporting activities. The procedure is usually performed by an arthroscopy (keyhole surgery), using a camera to see inside your knee, and typically takes an hour to 90 minutes.

Meniscus tear

The medial meniscus is a c-shaped cartilage in between the bones of the knee joint that acts as a cushion between the thighbone and shinbone. Tears can result from a sudden twist in your knee, heavy lifting, or general wear and tear as we age. Symptoms may include pain when you rotate or twist your knee, swelling, instability.

Knee replacement

A total knee replacement is a surgical procedure to resurface the knee joint with artificial parts. This provides improved stability and mobility and helps to alleviate pain you may have experienced as a result of worn cartilage in the knee, from osteoarthritis or a previous injury.

Arthrosamid® Injections

This is an innovative hydrogel-based injectable treatment that is ideal for individuals suffering from mild to moderate knee osteoarthritis (OA). It provides long-lasting relief in knee OA pain and discomfort, enabling patients to enjoy an improved quality of life without the need for surgery.

Once administered into the knee joint, it acts as a cushion, reducing friction and inflammation. The hydrogel integrates with the joint tissues, providing consistent pain relief and improving joint functionality over time.

A consultation with a specialist will determine if Arthrosamid® is the right choice. The treatment itself is administered through a single injection under local anaesthesia.

ROSA, the latest robotic surgical technology

As one of the UK's leading hospitals for knee replacement surgery, we have access to the latest Robotic Surgical Assistant (ROSA) technology. Whilst the procedure is broadly similar to traditional knee replacement surgery, it is performed with the help of a robotic assistant. This is simply an additional tool to guide your surgeon, who still carries out the entire procedure.

The ROSA system uses a series of X-rays to generate 3D images of your unique knee anatomy that enable the surgeon to design a personalised plan prior to performing surgery. It uses a camera and optical trackers attached to your leg, to provide real time information about the precise position of the knee during surgery and makes adjustments even with the slightest movement of your legs.



This ensures the surgical plan designed by your surgeon is carried out without any changes and with a high degree of precision.

In addition to helping surgeons place knee implants with greater precision, use of ROSA technology offers a number of additional benefits:

- **Reduced injury to adjacent tissues**
- **Increased longevity of the implant**
- **Smaller incisions with reduced scarring and minimal blood loss**
- **Less post-operative pain**
- **Shorter hospital stay and recovery period**
- **Quicker return to daily activities**
- **Lower incidence of complications**

We will need to determine if the ROSA Knee system is right for you, as the procedure typically takes longer than traditional surgery, and your surgeon will recommend if it is an option for you. ROSA based surgery is available to self-pay patients and through some insurance companies, so you will need to check with your insurance provider to see if they would specifically cover the ROSA procedure.

Ian Fraser chose our new Arthrosamid® procedure instead of knee replacement surgery

After decades of competitive sport and a lifetime on the rugby pitch, the strain on Ian Fraser's knees had worn away the cartilage in both joints. But instead of knee replacement surgery, Ian discovered a promising new alternative – Arthrosamid®, a non-surgical treatment recently introduced at The Horder Centre.

"I started playing rugby when I was six and carried on until I was 64," Ian explained. "In my 20s, I took up sprinting and the triple jump, and I also played competitive squash for 20 years—all things that aren't great for your knees.

"Eventually, after decades of wear and tear, my knees gave out while walking through the countryside on a shoot. From then on, I was in pain most of the time and even struggled with stairs. That's when I decided I had to do something about it."

Ian's GP arranged an X-ray at Queen Victoria Hospital in East Grinstead, and he was soon referred to Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon Mr Tofunmi Oni at The Horder Centre.

"Mr Oni confirmed that the cartilage had worn away in both knees," Ian said. "But he

also suggested trying something relatively new – Arthrosamid®. The idea of a less invasive option appealed to me, so I did some research. At 70, I was on the older side of the recommendation, but I'm fit and healthy."

Ian received his first Arthrosamid® injection, in his left knee, in December 2024. "I don't like injections," he laughed. "The local anaesthetic was the worst bit. I arrived at 9 am, had antibiotics at 9:30, and the injection at 11:30 – it took five minutes, and my wife drove me home by 11:45."

Eight weeks later, after a holiday and physiotherapy, he noticed real improvement. It also made him realise how bad his right knee had become, so in March 2025 he returned for another injection.

"My goodness, it's some sort of miracle," Ian said. "Just recently, I was rotovating the garden for two hours on hard ground without a twinge. Everything has been brilliant at The Horder Centre. I'd recommend it to anyone – if it's suitable for them."



Mr Oni said: "I was delighted to see that Mr Fraser not only experienced a significant improvement in his knee pain, but is also back enjoying the activities he loves, which had once been a real challenge for him."

Hip & Lower Back

Hip replacement

Over time, your hip joint can become damaged due to wear and tear as we get older, arthritic conditions or injury. If so, you may be referred for a total hip replacement, a surgical procedure to replace the joint. During the operation, the two parts of your hip joint are removed and replaced with smooth artificial surfaces. These artificial pieces (the prosthesis) are implanted into healthy portions of the pelvis and thigh bone. The hip replacement operation usually takes an hour to 90 minutes.

Lower back surgery

Lower back surgery treatments are designed to address different conditions that affect the lumbar spine, to relieve pain, restore function, and improve the overall quality of life for patients suffering from chronic back issues. The procedure will depend on the patient's condition but typically lumbar decompression surgery involves removal of portions of bone and soft tissue to relieve pressure on the spinal cord or nerves in the lower back.

Hip revision

Hip revision surgery may be needed for people who have previously undergone a hip replacement procedure. The procedure is required because after 10-15 years the implanted artificial joint may no longer fit correctly. The original prosthesis is removed and replaced with a new one. Sometimes this is a long process involving more than one surgical procedure and is certainly more taxing than the original replacement surgery.

Following a GP visit, an X-ray in January 2021 showed mild arthritis. Jo, 54, began physiotherapy in Lewes and committed to the exercises, which initially helped, but her progress soon plateaued. By 2024, another X-ray revealed severe arthritis. "I was advised that a minimally invasive hip replacement was the next step," she said. Her GP referred her to The Horder Centre in November 2024.

"The first person I saw was Advanced Practitioner Chris. He said my arthritis was quite severe and referred me to Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon Mr Syed Ahmed, who I met in January 2025. I was very impressed—he took time to explain the procedure clearly."

Jo wasn't nervous about surgery. "I felt ready. My friends and my mother had hip replacements at The Horder Centre and told me if you follow the exercises, you recover quickly."

Her experience confirmed it. "Everyone was brilliant and kind. I was treated like royalty. My husband stayed with me right up until I went under." Mr Ahmed's reassurance helped

Jo feel calm and informed. "I stayed one night after the operation. Everything I needed was provided and clearly explained. I was up and walking on one crutch the same day."

At home, Jo's recovery went smoothly. "They gave me a plastic cover so I could shower safely and a seat raiser for the toilet. I had

really supported, and my husband looked after me well."

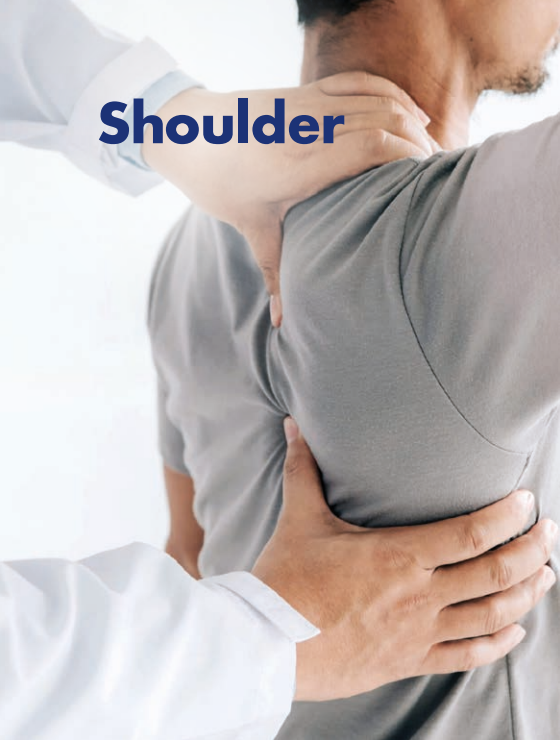

Shoulder



Rotator cuff

The rotator cuff is formed from four muscles and tendons that attach your arm to the top of your shoulder blade. Impingement or a tear are the usual types of damage that can happen to the rotator cuff. Rotator-cuff problems can cause pain and weakness in your shoulder. Surgery can help to reduce any pain and to get back some strength in your shoulder.

Shoulder arthroscopy

A shoulder arthroscopy is keyhole shoulder surgery that allows your surgeon to investigate or treat issues and pain inside the shoulder joint without the need to fully open it up. A thin tube with a camera is inserted through small incisions in your skin around the shoulder joint, allowing your surgeon to identify what is causing you pain. They should usually be able to treat some problems within the joint at the same time, such as repairing or removing torn tissue with surgical instruments.

Shoulder replacement

A shoulder replacement involves replacing the shoulder joint if it has been damaged by injury or worn away by arthritis. When arthritis affects the shoulder it causes the lining of these joint surfaces to wear, causing pain and stiffness. During a shoulder replacement, both the head of the humerus and the socket are replaced with artificial surfaces. Artificial shoulder parts are usually made of metal or plastic, or a combination of these. The operation usually takes 1 to 2 hours.

A broken hip from a car accident at 17 left keen tennis player Rebecca Putland with ongoing pain

"As the years passed, the pain got progressively worse," said Rebecca, now 54. "A physiotherapist urged me to see a surgeon about five or six years ago, but I brushed it off. I was still playing tennis for two hours a day but in a lot of pain, especially at night. Once I was moving, it eased, but I was stiff and limping."

Over time, Rebecca learned to compensate but eventually tore her right medial meniscus. "That was the turning point. I knew I had to do something." Her GP referred her to a local physiotherapist, but after six weeks without improvement, she was sent to The Horder Centre's Seaford clinic. There, she was assessed and referred to Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon Mr Senthil Kumar Velayudham.

"By then, I'd had X-rays," Rebecca said. "Mr Velayudham explained that my hip arthritis was severe enough to need a minimally invasive total hip replacement. I felt relief—but also regret for waiting so long."

Rebecca chose same-day discharge and



had the first surgery slot of the morning, with an epidural and sedation. "The epidural wore off in a few hours, and I was walking laps of the ward on two sticks by the afternoon. I was discharged home at 6pm."

The next day brought some stiffness, but within three days, she was out watching a tennis match. Determined, she followed her exercise plan carefully and was off painkillers by day ten. "By week two, I was walking without sticks at home, and by week four, completely off them."

At six weeks, Rebecca returned to the gym, swimming 20–40 lengths several times a

week and gradually rebuilding strength. By week eight, she was

playing padel, attending body pump, and enjoying long walks with her dog.

A brief spell of soreness at week six was checked by Mr Velayudham—X-rays showed the hip was healing perfectly. "The care I received was fantastic. Every person was kind and understanding," Rebecca said. "I no longer feel any pain when I walk—and I can finally do so without limping."

"12 weeks have gone by so quickly."

"I am now back to all my activities and have no trouble sleeping due to hip pain anymore."

Hand and Wrist



Carpal tunnel syndrome

Carpal tunnel syndrome is a condition where there is increased pressure on a nerve that crosses the front of your wrist (the median nerve). The median nerve runs through a tight tunnel, together with the tendons that bend your fingers. If the tunnel becomes too tight it can cause pressure on the nerve, usually resulting in pain or numbness in the thumb, index and middle fingers. Carpal tunnel release is usually performed under a local anaesthetic and takes about 20 minutes. You should be able to go home the same day.

Dupuytren's

Dupuytren's contracture affects the palmar fascia (a cord of fibrous tissue) in your palm and fingers, causing the fascia to thicken and shorten. Knots of scar-like tissue form under your skin over time, pulling your fingers towards your palm. Dupuytren's contracture generally affects your ring and little finger, but you can have it in both hands. It can take months or years for your condition to become severe enough to require treatment. We do not recommend treatment if your condition is in its early stages. No one can cure Dupuytren's contracture, but surgery can relieve your symptoms.

Trapeziectomy

Arthritis around the base of the thumb is usually due to everyday wear and tear and can cause pain, stiffness and deformity in the thumb. Trapeziectomy surgery involves removing a small bone (one of eight which form the wrist) called the trapezium. This is situated at the base of the thumb. This provides more space for the thumb to move so that the arthritic bone surfaces are not rubbing together causing pain. The operation will usually involve you coming in hospital for a day.

Foot and Ankle



Bunion surgery

A bunion is a bony lump on the side of the foot at the base of the big toe. The most common cause of bunions is footwear that does not have enough width to fit the toes in their natural position. They are occasionally associated with arthritis of the joint at the base of the big toe.

The operation may involve removing the bunion, releasing or tightening ligaments, realigning your big toe, stiffening a joint and straightening your smaller toes.

The operation usually takes 30 minutes to an hour and you should be able to go home the same day or the day after.

Ankle arthrodesis

If you have severe arthritis in your ankle, an ankle arthrodesis should reduce your pain and allow you to do more of your normal activities. Your surgeon will remove the damaged joint surfaces. They will then fix the bones together with a metal plate, a metal rod, or screws. The operation usually takes between an hour and an hour and a half. You should be able to go home after one to three days.

designed to keep you in shape and help strengthen joints and muscles.

Classes are led by expert instructors and are dedicated to helping you achieve your fitness goals, with a special focus on enhancing mobility, flexibility, and overall well-being.

Balance & Flexibility

This class is aimed at people who are over 60 and afraid of falling, or who have had one of two falls. It is for those who want to improve their strength, balance and, confidence in performing daily activities, mobility and independence, with a guided exercise programme.
